Scott Falcone is the Director of the South Carolina School for the Deaf and the Blind – Division of Outreach Services. As the Division Director, he is responsible for oversight of statewide outreach programming that includes Educational Programs, Sign Language Interpreting Services, Inter-agency Deaf-Blind Project, Equipment Distribution Program and Early Intervention Services. All programmatic service provisions target the needs of infants, children and citizens with sensory disabilities, their families and the professionals who serve them. In addition, Scott is a Certified Public Manager and holds an Advanced Certification in Sign Language Interpreting along with experience in Educational Program Administration.

Scott is from Syracuse, New York, is a graduate of the State University of New York Institute of Technology, and has lifelong experience with deafness as a C.O.D.A. – Child of Deaf Adults.
